

Kiera Scarf Written in USA Terms Week 1

You need approx. 590yd of 3 weight yarn

I have used Lion Brand Mandala which is 5.3oz

Make sure the yarn isn't fluffy or a dark colour if you are new to crochet

J – 10 or 6 mm Crochet hook

Darning needle

The scarf is approx. 6-7" wide and 60-70" long plus fringe.

CH Chain – Wrap the yarn round the hook and draw it through the loop on the hook.

SC Single Crochet - Insert your hook into the stitch (or chain space) that you'd like the SC to be made in, wrap the yarn over your hook and pull the yarn through the stitch. You now have 2 loops on the hook. Wrap the yarn over your hook again, pull the yarn through the 2 loops already on your hook.

HDC Half Double Crochet - Wrap your yarn around your hook first. Then insert your hook into the stitch (or chain space) that you'd like the HDC to be made in wrap the yarn over your hook and pull the yarn through the stitch (or chain space). You now have 3 loops on the hook. Wrap the yarn over your hook again, pull the wrapped yarn through the 3 loops already on your hook.

DC Double Crochet - Wrap your yarn around your hook first. Then insert your hook into the stitch (or chain space) that you'd like the DC to be made in, wrap the yarn over your hook and pull the yarn through the stitch (or chain space). You now have 3 loops on the hook. Wrap the yarn over the hook again and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops already on your hook. Wrap the yarn over your hook once more and pull the yarn through the 2 loops already on your hook.

Bobble 4-DC Bobble* Wrap your yarn around your hook first insert the hook into the next stitch, wrap your yarn around your hook and pull through, yarn over and pull through two stitches. repeated from * 4 times and you will end up with 5 loops on your hook. Yarn over and pull through all of the 5 loops on the hook. Please note the bobbles appear on the back of the work. They will always be worked on an odd numbered row.

Turning Chain When you CH1 at the end of a row this is a turning chain and not a stitch. Place your first stitch of the row into the last stitch of the previous row. This should help to keep your sides straight.

To Make the Kiera Scarf

If you are using a colour changing yarn please take off 2m approx. 5ft for the fringe, so that it matches the starting edge of your scarf.

Make a slip stitch then Chain (CH) 24

Row 1: Single Crochet (SC) in 2nd chain from hook and in each chain across you will have 23 stitches. CH 1 and turn.

Row 2: Half Double Crochet (HDC) in each stitch. 23 Stitches. CH 1 and turn.

Rows 3 – 16: HDC in each stitch. 23 Stitches. CH 1 and turn.



Row 17: Square Holes – DC into first stitch, * CH 1, skip a stitch, DC into the next stitch. Repeat from * to the last stitch which is a DC. 23 Stitches and 11 holes. CH 1 and turn.

Row 18: HDC into first stitch, then * HDC into the chain space, HDC into the top of the next DC repeat from * to the last stitch, HDC Crochet in the last stitch. 23 Stitches. CH 1 and turn.

Row 19: Square Holes – DC into first stitch, * CH 1, skip a stitch, DC into the next stitch. Repeat from * to the last stitch which is a DC. 23 Stitches and 11 holes. CH 1 and turn.

Row 20: HDC into first stitch, then * HDC into the chain space, HDC into the top of the next DC repeat from * to the last stitch, HDC Crochet in the last stitch. 23 Stitches. CH 1 and turn.

Row 21: Square Holes – DC into first stitch, * CH 1, skip a stitch, DC into the next stitch. Repeat from * to the last stitch which is a DC. 23 Stitches and 11 holes. CH 1 and turn.

Row 22: HDC into first stitch, then * HDC into the chain space, HDC into the top of the next DC repeat from * to the last stitch, HDC Crochet in the last stitch. 23 Stitches. CH 1 and turn.

Rows 23 – 50: HDC in each stitch. 23 Stitches. Chain 1 and turn.
